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What are Urbanized Areas? (1)

- Typically abbreviated as UZAs (Census) and UAs (FHWA)
- Census Bureau national classification of land as either urban or rural
 - Urbanized Area: urban area with population more than 50,000
 - Urban Cluster (UC): urban area with population more than 2,500 and less than 50,000
 - Rural area: land not contained in a UZA or UC
- Based primarily on population counts and residential population density (computed on land area only)
 - National Land Cover Database also used to identify territory with high imperviousness

What are Urbanized Areas? (2)


- Census "does not take into account or attempt to meet the requirements of any nonstatistical uses of these areas or their associated data"
- Nonetheless, UZAs tied to many Federal programs and formulas, including Metropolitan Planning
- Updated every ten years, following completion of decennial Census
- Draft criteria for delineating Census 2010 UZAs published in August 24, 2010 Federal Register
- Final delineation criteria published in August 24, 2011 Federal Register
- Census 2010 UZAs released on March 27, 2012

Census Bureau Procedures for Delineating Urbanized Areas (1)


- Automated, GIS-based process performed by Census Bureau, Geography Division
- Identify initial urban area core
 - Contiguous census tracts, each having a land area of less than 3 square miles and a population density of 1,000 persons per square mile
- Add census blocks to initial urban area core if contiguous and meets at least one of the following criteria:
 - Population density of at least 500 persons per square mile
 - At least one-third of the census block is territory with at least 20% imperviousness and meets Census "compactness" criteria
 - Above imperviousness criteria and at least 40% of block boundary is contiguous with qualifying territory
- Repeat until all qualifying contiguous territory added...

Census Bureau Procedures for Delineating Urbanized Areas (2)

- Add non-contiguous territory separated by exempted territory (water, undevelopable land, etc.)
- Add non-contiguous territory via "hops and jumps"
 - Hop: along a road connection of no more than 0.5 miles (multiple hops allowed along same road connection)
 - Jump: along a road connection more than 0.5 miles but no more than 2.5 miles (only one jump permitted along any given road connection)

Census Bureau Procedures for Delineating Urbanized Areas (3)

- Add enclaves (non-qualifying area surrounding by urban area) based on inclusion criteria
- Split large agglomerations and merge individual urban areas (if necessary)
- Add indentations, airports, and additional non-residential urban territory (if necessary)
- Assign UC/UZA name







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


Breakdown of TPB Modeled Area Population by Census 2010 UZA



Compare 2000 and 2010 UZA Population (1)




Compare 2000 and 2010 UZA Population (2)




Change in Urban / Rural Land and Population Density

Significant Geographic Findings for Census 2010 Washington, DC UZA

- Most new urbanized area occurs in Loudoun and Prince William Counties, VA
- Additional new urbanized area in Montgomery and Prince George's County, MD
- 2010 Washington, DC UZA extends into Fauquier County, VA, Frederick County, MD and Carroll County, MD
- 2010 Washington, DC UZA does not connect with 2010 Fredericksburg UZA

Significant Geographic Findings for other Census 2010 UZAs near TPB Region

- Growth in Waldorf, MD UZA (formerly St. Charles UZA) and Fredericksburg, VA UZA
- Growth in Frederick, MD UZA
- New Lexington Park--California—Chesapeake Ranch Estates, MD UZA located in St. Mary's and Calvert Counties
- Growth in Baltimore, MD UZA and Westminster--Eldersburg, MD UZA

- No local government review nor appeal process
- State DOTs and FHWA will create "generalized" UZAs for transportation planning purposes
- MPO designation for Lexington Park--California— Chesapeake Ranch Estates, MD UZA located in St. Mary's and Calvert Counties
