

The Housing Continuum






Literally Homeless Population Has Increased by 5% Since 2005

Formerly and Literally Homeless by Jurisdiction, (2005-2009)



Recommendations To Reduce Homelessness (2008)

- More targeted resources to prevent homelessness (emergency rental assistance, short-term support).
- Housing First Approach placing people in housing first instead of emergency shelter and provide them with supportive services.
- Jobs that pay a living wage increase incomes.
- Creating affordable housing opportunities at ALL income levels.
