COG established the Potomac Regional Education Partnership (PREP) program in 2001. PREP is a public-private partnership that seeks to strengthen regional education and workforce policies and programs. PREP members include area K-12 public school systems, community colleges and universities, and business organizations and other stakeholders. The Board will be briefed on PREP's recent activities, proposed FY 2005 work program, and development and fundraising plans.

D. Update on Disease Surveillance (1:05 – 1:20 p.m.)

The region has started syndromic surveillance using the Electronic Surveillance System for the Early Notification of Community-based Epidemics (ESSENCE) system as a test product. The Disease Surveillance Annex of the RECP has been updated and is presented to the COG Board for approval.

9. INSTITUTE FOR REGIONAL EXCELLENCE TEAM PROJECT PRESENTATIONS (1:20 – 1:35 p.m.)

IRE Class Project Teams

COG established the Institute for Regional Excellence (IRE) in 2000. The IRE is a collaborative effort among stakeholders in the region focusing on leadership training as an important element of regional development. The Board will receive brief project presentations from this year's participants in the Regional Executive Development Program: three in June and three in July. Presentations are: "Regional Communication System for the General Public", "Seamless School-to-Careers Opportunities in the Greater Washington Metropolitan Area" and "Regional Public Education to Reduce Pollution in the Chesapeake Bay."

10. STATUS AND NEXT STEPS IN THE REGIONAL AIR QUALITY PLANNING PROCESS

(1:35 - 2:00 p.m.)

At its May meeting, the Board was briefed on the recent work of the Metropolitan Washington Air Quality Committee (MWAQC) to prepare an air quality attainment plan for the "one hour" federal health standard for ozone, as well as a preview of the upcoming planning effort to prepare a plan to meet the new "eight hour" federal health standard for ozone.

As part of this briefing, the Board was also informed about an ongoing dialogue between the MWAQC local elected official leadership, COG staff, and representatives of the state environmental and transportation secretaries, regarding potential revisions to the MWAQC planning process. In response to the Board's request, MWAQC Chair Tom Dernoga, assisted by COG's legal and environmental staff, will review the status of the discussions and next steps. Attached are two memos on the history of the MWAQC planning process, and an analysis of Section 174 of the Clean Air Act.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Receive briefing and discuss next steps, including local government communication with state officials on the MWAQC planning process.

11. CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS

(A) Pension Plan Administrative Committee

The Board of Directors will be asked to adopt Resolution R31-04, which would expand the COG Pension Plan Administrative Committee by adding two additional COG members. The PPAC currently has one COG member official, in addition to employee-elected and management representatives. It will also require Board approval for committee membership.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Adopt Resolution R31-04.

(B) Resolution Authorizing the Executive Director to Execute a Contract With the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to Facilitate the Development of a Regional Health Information Infrastructure System

The Board will be asked to adopt Resolution R32-04, authorizing the Executive Director or his designee to execute a contract with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, not to exceed \$200,000 to fund Council of Government support for the planning and development of a Regional Health Information Infrastructure System. No COG matching funds are required.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Adopt Resolution R32-04.
