Diesel Prices


The U.S. Energy Information Administration reported that the retail average price for diesel fuel edged up one-tenth of a cent to \$3.959 during the last week of September 2008. The East Coast continues to hold the highest price despite the mild damage from hurricanes in the Gulf. Diesel sold for \$4.02 on the East Coast, up 96.8 cents from a year ago. *Traffic World Daily Briefing 9-30-08*



Traffic Cure Worsens the Pain

Washingtonians have the second worst commute in the country in terms of time spent on the road, after New York. Metropolitan Washington region business owners increasingly notice congestion impacting their operations. For example, Virginia-based Guernsey Office Products have added a new location in Maryland to avoid deliveries across the congested Potomac River crossings. Fairfax County schools have bought additional school-buses to keep on schedule. The additional vehicles are the "cost of doing business" and add to congestion and fuel the cycle.
