Mr. Chairman and Committee Members,

Thank you for the opportunity to provide comments on the Metropolitan Washington Air Quality Committee (MWAQC) Environmental Justice (EJ) Action Plan. My name is Karen Moe and I am a 40-year resident of Cheverly, an inner beltway community that is overburdened by air pollution and air pollution sources.

As a member of the Cheverly Environmental Justice Action Team (EJAT) I support the team's comments. My comments focus on the critical role that communitybased, hyper-local air monitoring networks play in a successful plan to reduce air pollution in overburdened communities.

In 2019 I volunteered to be the Cheverly liaison to the University of Maryland team that is implementing a community-driven hyper-local sensor network to monitor particulate matter PM2.5 on the ground in Cheverly and neighboring communities. The network has over 20 sites and UMD is continuing to expand into our neighboring communities. In 2021 MDE produced a detailed report on the Cheverly area air quality and the network is now used to target and implement emission reduction actions and identify high-risk issues for future actions.

In 2023 Cheverly was one of the community partners with MDE and UMD to be awarded a \$500,000 EPA grant to expand the network with high quality sensors adding other volatile organic compounds (VOCs). This year UMD installed several black carbon monitors and our community members are closely monitoring the data. The network is a great example of community empowerment and citizen science. Our partners at MDE and UMD have been amazingly helpful.

My recommendation is that the Metropolitan Washington AQ Committee Environmental Justice Plan needs to establish a regional support center, to help fund and build community-based, hyper-local air monitoring networks in EJ communities across the region. Federal funds are available and local universities can help with education and technical issues. I would be happy to share my experiences. Thank you.
