

Why Buildings and Energy Codes?

- Buildings use 40% of energy in U.S. and contribute 40% of CO₂ emissions
- Building codes provide specific, detailed design and construction criteria that must be met, approved to receive building permit
- ➤ International Code Council process updates codes every three years
 - > Energy is the primary focus







Supporting the 30% Solution

Proposals for the 2012 International Energy

Conservation Code (IECC) include:

- More efficient windows and doors
- More efficient lighting
- Increased insulation
- Air sealing and testing for envelope and ductwork
- More efficient hot water and HVAC systems



2012 IECC expected to have energy savings of at least 15% over 2009 IECC and 30% over 2006 IECC




Why Local Governments Must Get Involved

- Local Government Employees Control the Outcome
 - ICC Government Members (your municipal/county code officials) will decide fate of the 2012 IECC in Charlotte in October
- Significant Impact of Success or Failure
 - 2012 IECC could impact millions of homes to be built through 2015
 - Annual Impacts by 2030: 3 Quads, 160 MMT CO2, and \$20 billion consumer savings
