#### Package Delivery Company Reports Growth in 1rst Quarter

UPS 1rst Quarter profits grew by 7%, beating analyst forecasts. The company reports an increase in consumer spending spillover after the holidays with gift cards and returns.

## Anthony Foxx nominated to serve as US Secretary of Transportation

President Obama nominated Anthony Foxx, mayor of Charlotte, North Carolina to suceed Secretary Ray LaHood at the US Department of Transportation. Confirmation is anticipated.



A lawyer by training, as mayor of Charlotte, Mr. Foxx worked to build the

Charlotte Streetcar Project, one of several electric trolley systems underway in the country. Mr. Foxx has also worked to expand the LYNX light-rail system so it can reach the University of North Carolina at Charlotte.

#### Virginia Working to Improve Dulles Intl Airport Access

Virginia's Office of Intermodal Planning and investment released a *study* to the Commonwealth Transportation Board of the limited access, north-south highway, which would arc west of Dulles International Airport. Advocates say the proposed highway would make Dulles Airport a major air freight hub.
