RESOLUTION ON AMENDMENT TO

THE FY 2003-2008 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP) THAT IS EXEMPT FROM THE AIR QUALITY CONFORMITY REQUIREMENT TO ADD FUNDING FOR PLANNING AND RIGHT-OF-WAY FOR PROTECTIVE AND HARDSHIP ACQUISITIONS FOR THE INTERCOUNTY CONNECTOR (ICC) PROJECT, AS REQUESTED BY THE MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (MDOT)

WHEREAS, the National Capital Region Transportation Planning Board (TPB), which is the metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for the Washington Region, has the responsibility under the provisions of the Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century (TEA-21) for developing and carrying out a continuing, cooperative and comprehensive transportation planning process for the Metropolitan Area; and

WHEREAS, on July 17, 2002 the TPB adopted the Constrained Long-Range Transportation Plan (CLRP) and the FY 2003-2008 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), and these documents were approved by the Federal Highway and Transit Administrations on October 30, 2002; and

WHEREAS, in the attached letter of August 20, 2003, MDOT has requested an amendment to the FY 2003-2008 TIP to remove the East-West Link Improvements project, replace it with the Intercounty Connector (ICC) project, and add \$65 million in STP/Grant Anticipation Revenue Vehicle (GARVEE) bonds/State bonds for project planning and \$79.4 million in GARVEE bonds/State bonds for right-of-way funding for protective and hardship acquisitions only, as described in the attached materials; and

WHEREAS, planning funds and right-of-way funding for protective and hardship acquisitions only are exempt from the air quality conformity requirement, as defined in Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulations "40 CFR Parts 51 and 93 Transportation Conformity Rule Amendments: Flexibility and Streamlining; Final Rule," issued in the August 15, 1997 *Federal Register*, and

WHEREAS, in order to allow for public comment information on this amendment was provided at the TPB Citizens Advisory Committee meeting on September 11;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the National Capital Region Transportation Planning Board amends the FY 2003-2008 TIP to remove the East-West Link Improvements project, replace it with the Intercounty Connector (ICC) project, and add \$65 million in STP/Grant Anticipation Revenue Vehicle (GARVEE) bonds/State bonds for project planning and \$79.4 million in GARVEE bonds/State bonds for right-of-way funding for protective and hardship acquisitions only, as described in the attached materials.

Intercounty Connector (Montgomery and Prince George's counties)

Attached is an amendment for inclusion in the FY 2003-2008 National Capital Region Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and the FY 2003 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). The purpose of the amendment is to add project planning and right-of-way (for protective and hardship acquisitions only) funds for the Intercounty Connector (ICC), which will replace the East-West Link Improvements project already in the TIP. The East-West Link Improvements project is included in the FY 2003-2008 Consolidated Transportation Program (CTP). The ICC Project Information Form is attached. We are requesting that the existing TIP and STIP be amended to reflect this change to maintain the current project schedule.

Project: East-West Link Improvements (TIP: 2003-62-1/STIP: H-158-17)

Improvement: Study to construct new east-west link improvements in Montgomery and Prince

George's counties between I-270 and I-95/US 1.

Comment: This amendment converts the East-West Link Improvements project into the ICC

and adds project planning and right-of-way funds to FY 2003 and FY 2004. The ICC is intended to serve as the regional, east-west highway facility that has long been a part of local land use planning in order to support the region's orderly growth and development patterns. The FY 2003 STIP currently contains \$2.0 million in project planning funds, as does the FY 2003-2008 TIP. The scope of this study will be modified to cover project planning necessary for resumption of studies to acquire state and federal approval of an ICC. The ICC will replace the

East-West Link Improvements in the TIP and STIP.

*A Grant Anticipation Revenue Vehicle or GARVEE is a debt financing instrument authorized to receive federal reimbursement of debt service and related financing costs under Section 122 of Title 23, United States Code. GARVEE financing can expand access to capital markets, as a supplement to general obligation or revenue bonds, and funds are repaid through future federal-aid reimbursements.

ICC Project Overview

The ICC Study area is located in Montgomery and Prince George's counties, north of Washington D.C., extending from I-270 to I-95/US 1, and from the Capital Beltway to the Patuxent River. The study corridor is approximately 20 miles in length.

The project will follow the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) process. Through this process, government agencies and the public assess proposed projects in terms of their potential impacts on the community and the environment. It is under the NEPA umbrella that social, environmental, and economic impacts are addressed. A full range of reasonable alternatives will be considered based upon the project's purpose and need.

Some of the activities that the project planning funds will be used for include:

- Identifying the appropriate type of facility
- Developing potential alignments
- Assessing impacts to adjacent properties
- Developing cost estimates
- Preparing an Environmental Impact Statement
- Citizen and permitting agencies involvement
- Preliminary engineering to support a sound environmental decision

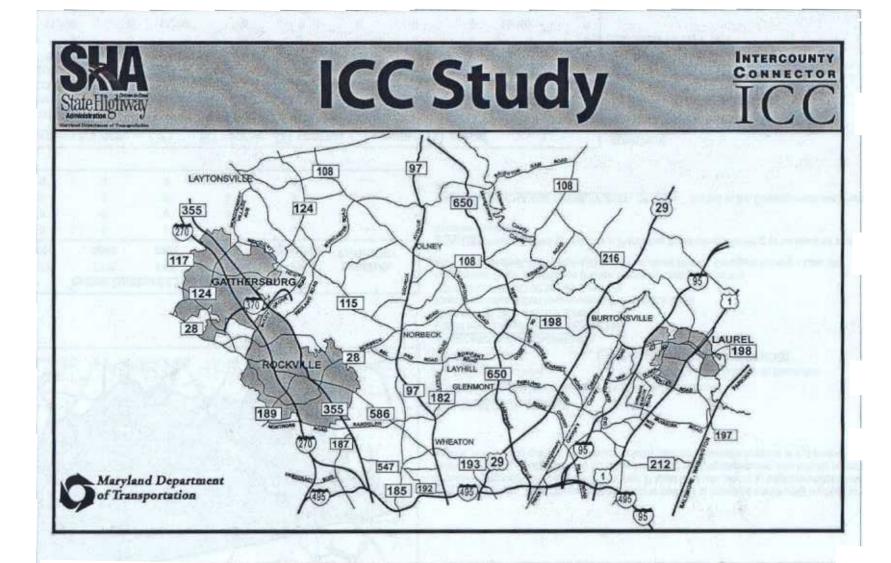

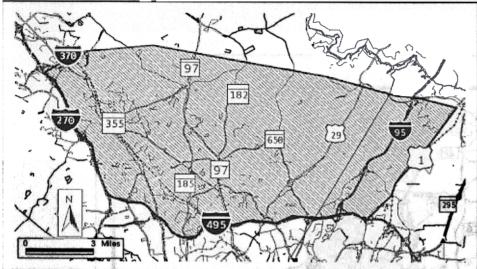
