MIRR Overview

- Department of Defense, Office of Local Defense Community Cooperation (OLDCC) – Military Installation Sustainability Program
 - Provide technical and financial assistance to states and local governments to analyze and implement actions necessary to foster, protect, and enhance military installation sustainability
 - A primary components of the program is the Military Installation Resilience Review (MIRR)
- The purpose of the MIRR is to identify the risks, hazards, and vulnerabilities of concern outside the installation ("outside the fence line"), as it relates to the ability of the military to carry out its mission on the base that could be mitigated through investments and solutions in the community. The MIRR process includes developing a strategy for implementation.



MIRR Overview

- Military Installation Resilience is defined as "the capability of a military installation to avoid, prepare for, minimize the effect of, adapt to, and recover from extreme weather events, or from anticipated or unanticipated changes in environmental conditions, that do, or have the potential to, adversely affect the military installation or essential transportation, logistical, or other necessary resources outside of the military installation that are necessary in order to maintain, improve, or rapidly reestablish installation mission assurance and mission-essential functions."
- OLDCC has provided grant funds to COG, Northern Virginia Regional Commission (NVRC), and Charles County to conduct resilience reviews.








NVRC MIRR – Northern Virginia Locations




Charles County MIRR Location
