


- Expanded or New Programs:

Local Initiatives ("Bundle")



- Commitments carried over from 1-hour ozone SIP:
 - Locomotive Idling Reduction
 - Gas Can Replacements
 - Low VOC Paints
 - Remote Sensing








Inclusion of Voluntary Bundle in the SIP

- Emission Benefits (2009)
 - 0.30 tpd NOx
 - -0.19 tpd VOC
- Annual Reporting Requirement
- Periodic True-up Evaluation







Additional Voluntary Programs

- Programs for Weight of Evidence:
 - Episodic Programs
 - High Electricity Demand Day Initiative
 - Urban Tree Canopy
 - Telecommute Initiatives







Low-Emission Vehicle Purchases and Diesel Retrofits

- Potential Emission Benefits
 - <0.30 tpd VOC for Diesel Retrofits
 - <0.003 tpd NOx for LEV Purchases
- Credits can be used for Transportation Conformity or the SIP, not both.
