USCM Climate Change Programs

U.S. Mayors Climate Protection Agreement

- Seattle Mayor Greg Nickels initiated in spring, 2005
- Scope similar to Kyoto Protocol: local commitments to CO₂ emissions reductions
- Original goal: 141 Mayors' commitment
- USCM adopted the agreement as policy in summer of 2005
- As of January 25 2007, 376 Mayors have signed
- New goal: 500 Mayors by summer, 2007

USCM Climate Change Programs

What's in it for Mayors...

- Cities and their day-to-day operations have less negative impact on the Earth's climate
- Evidence suggest long-term economic benefits and other environmental improvements - e.g., better air quality, improved public health
- Examples of local environmental leadership engenders positive press coverage and public relations
- Acting now shows the federal government that concern is real and local leaders are unwilling to wait
