# RESOLUTION APPROVING AN AMENDMENT TO THE FY 2009-2014 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP) THAT IS EXEMPT FROM THE AIR QUALITY CONFORMITY REQUIREMENT TO ADD FUNDING FROM THE AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT FOR SEVEN PROJECTS AS REQUESTED BY THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (DDOT)

**WHEREAS**, the National Capital Region Transportation Planning Board (TPB), which is the metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for the Washington Region, has the responsibility under the provisions of the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, and Efficient Transportation Equity Act - A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) of 2005 for developing and carrying out a continuing, cooperative and comprehensive transportation planning process for the Metropolitan Area; and

**WHEREAS**, the TIP is required by Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) as a basis and condition for all federal funding assistance to state, local and regional agencies for transportation improvements within the Washington planning area; and

**WHEREAS**, on November 19, 2008 the TPB adopted amendments to the FY 2009-2014 TIP which was adopted on July 16, 2008; and

**WHEREAS**, on February 17, 2009, the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA), which includes substantial new funding for the nation's transportation system, was enacted; and

**WHEREAS,** in the attached letters of March 9 and 18, 2009, DDOT has requested an amendment to the FY 2009-2014 TIP to add \$67,800,000 in ARRA funding for the following projects:

- Bicycle Sharing (SmartBike) \$3 million,
- Replacing the deck on the New York Avenue Bridge over Railroad Tracks \$40 million,
- Replacing the Eastern Avenue Bridge over Kenilworth Avenue \$12 million,
- Streetscape improvements on K Street NW from 7<sup>th</sup> Street to New Jersey Avenue \$5.5 million,
- Safe Routes to Schools \$4 million.
- Citywide Streetlight Construction \$2.3 million, and
- Resurfacing Streets and Freeways Citywide \$1 million, as described in the attached materials; and

**WHEREAS**, these projects are exempt from the air quality conformity requirement, as defined in Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulations "40 CFR Parts 51 and 93 Transportation Conformity Rule Amendments: Flexibility and Streamlining; Final Rule," issued in the May 6, 2005, *Federal Register;* 

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION TRANSPORTATION PLANNING BOARD amends the FY 2009-2014 TIP to add \$67,800,000 in ARRA funding for the following projects:

- Bicycle Sharing (SmartBike) \$3 million,
- Replacing the deck on the New York Avenue Bridge over Railroad Tracks \$40 million,
- Replacing the Eastern Avenue Bridge over Kenilworth Avenue \$12 million,
- Streetscape improvements on K Street NW from 7<sup>th</sup> Street to New Jersey Avenue \$5.5 million,
- Safe Routes to Schools \$4 million,
- Citywide Streetlight Construction \$2.3 million, and
- Resurfacing Streets and Freeways Citywide \$1 million, as described in the attached materials.

As you are aware, the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) was signed into law on February 17, 2009, and the United States Department of Transportation (US DOT) has advised the state departments of transportation and metropolitan planning organizations to take necessary actions to utilize the funds provided by it quickly and effectively.

The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) is continuing to evaluate the details and criteria of the ARRA. The District, as a member of the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority, whole-heartedly supports new ARRA projects put forward by WMATA at last month's meeting of the Transportation Planning Board (TPB).

Regarding roadways, DDOT has identified a list of projects that are ready to proceed. These projects will create jobs and support the long-term growth of our economy. With the exception of the project to create new sidewalks along federal-aid routes where none now exist, all of the other projects have already been approved in the District's prior-year Transportation Improvement Programs (TIPs). These projects, therefore, have already been accounted for and approved as part of the region's mandatory air quality conformity process. They have also been subject to public review and comment. The project to create new sidewalks along federal-aid routes is exempt from air quality conformity analysis.

DDOT requests that Transportation Planning Board approve several TIP amendments. Primarily, these amendments add ARRA funding to a project or substitute ARRA funds for STP funds which will then be applied to other projects. The net effect is to allow DDOT to accomplish more projects sooner than if the ARRA funds had not been available. All of the projects listed below will have the identified stimulus funds obligated during FY09.

  - o Total Funding = \$6.45 million
- Citywide Streetlight Construction

Total ARRA funding for these projects is estimated at \$72.6 million. These projects are estimated to support 2,016 jobs.

Dear Mr. Jenkins and members of the TPB,

In the packet before you are requested modifications and amendments to the District's portion of the Region's FY 2009 – FY 20014 TIP necessary to implement the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA). Since these letters were sent, we have made minor adjustments as follows:

- In TPB R20-2009, at the bottom of the pages one and two, please strike \$5.8 million and substitute \$1 million.
- In my March 9<sup>th</sup> letter to Charles Jenkins, on page two,
  - o halfway down the page is the "K Street" project. Please change "Total Funding" from \$5.5 million to \$11 million. We mistakenly requested a substitution of funds, when it was our intent to add \$5.5 million in ARRA funds to the \$5.5 million in STP funds already there.
  - o In the last bullet, change \$5.8 million to \$1.0 million and change "Total Funding" from \$22.28 million to \$17.48 million for FY09.
  - o In the 2<sup>nd</sup> to last paragraph, change "Total ARRA funding" from \$72.6 million to \$67.8 million. Also, change the number of jobs supported from 2,016 to 1,882.
- On "Proposed for Amendment," page D-3 for "Resurfacing Streets and Freeways Citywide," please change FY09 construction from \$22.28 million to \$17.48 million. At the end of this line, please change ARRA funds from \$5.8 million to \$1 million.

- In my March 9<sup>th</sup> letter to Ron Kirby, on page two:
  - Under "Neighborhood Streetscape Improvements," we converted \$19.8 million of STP funds to ARRA funds. In addition, we are adding another \$4.8 million of ARRA funds to this project so that a subproject can be moved up from 2011 to 2009. (This was the reason for reducing the Resurfacing item from \$5.8 million to \$1 million previously.)
  - o In the second-to-last paragraph, "Total funding" is changed from \$50.9 million to \$55.7 million. Also, the number of jobs supported by this spending increases from 1,413 to 1,546.
- On page D-2 of the following tables, the second project is "Neighborhood Streetscape Improvements." Total FY09 ARRA construction funding increases from \$19.8 million to \$24.6 million.

Let me thank TPB staff for their excellent work and cooperation. It was not easy to translate some of our instructions, but they did a great job. And let me again apologize to my fellow TPB members for these last-minute changes. We will do better in the future to make sure that we send out the right information in a timely manner.

Finally, for everyone's convenience, I am attaching all the projects correctly described in one place on an attachment to this letter.
