- COG staff track various bills during the legislative session that fall within COG's legislative priorities

- A series of ad hoc calls are held to determine specific bills to send comment letters on
- The committee primarily runs from January April

# Virginia Legislation

#### State Air Pollution Control Board

 A series of bills seek to repeal the requirement that the State Air Pollution Control Board implement a low-emissions and zero-emissions vehicle program for motor vehicles with a model year of 2025 and later

#### Data Centers

Several bills seek to require data center operators to meet certain energy efficiency standards in order to be eligible for the sales and use tax exemption for data center purchases. Bills have also been introduced to require site assessments to examine the effect of data centers on water usage and carbon emissions as well as impacts on agricultural resources.



## **Maryland Legislation**

- Climate and Environmental Equity
  - Legislation would require an evaluation regarding the impact of permit issuance related to climate and environmental equity.
- Solar Program
  - Legislation would establish a program for the purpose of increasing deployment of customersited solar energy generating system and providing grants to eligible customer-generators for certain solar energy generating systems.
- Smart Growth
  - A variety of bills seek to alter membership and duties of the Smart Growth Cabinet.
