The availability of housing at a range of incomes is critical to a functional and competitive regional economy. Over the past year and a half, Urban Institute and COG have developed a comprehensive new study of housing security funded by the Community Foundation of the National Capital Region and Cafritz Foundation. The Housing Security Study is the first of its kind to examine demand, supply, and gaps at the jurisdiction level in our region along the housing continuum from homeless shelters to affordable homeownership programs.
