characteristics, especially bus usage, for lowincome and minority populations. The findings from this analysis have been presented to the Access for All Advisory Committee and the

Technical Committee.



- How accessible is employment by transit?




































































## **Findings**

- Most minority and disadvantaged workers are more likely to use alternative modes to driving alone, especially bus, compared to all workers
- These groups are also more likely to live near transit stops, compared to the general population
- More office and retail jobs are accessible by bus than by rail
