





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PURPOSE

- A. Identify viable strategies for Energy, Transportation, Land Use, and Built Environment sectors
 - for local, regional, state & national levels
- B. Analyze Strategies
 - Quantify benefits, costs, co-benefits, and estimate implementation timeframe
- C. Explore greenhouse gas emission reduction goals, measures and/or targets for the four sectors
- D. Jointly develop an action plan for the region



A. Identify set of <u>viable</u> strategies for local, regional, state & national levels

Illustrative strategy examples:

- Triple renewable energy production by 2020
- Increase proportion of electric vehicles in fleet to 15% by 2030
- Increase proportion of new housing in Activity Centers to 75% by 2040
- Increase transit mode share to 20% by 2050



B. Analyze Strategies:Quantify benefits, costs, co-benefits, and estimate implementation timeframe

 - air quality
 - environment
 - transportation
 - land use
 - others?
- Qualitative and Quantitative
- Implementation timeframe



C. Explore greenhouse gas emission reduction goals, measures and/or targets for the four sectors

- Review goals, measures, and/or targets in other regions
- Assess potential CO₂ reduction from viable strategies analyzed for this region
- Review funding needs and implementation timeframes for viable strategies identified for this region
