# 12:45 PM 3. DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA CLIMATE PROJECTIONS AND SCENARIO DEVELOPMENT

Kate Johnson, District Department of Energy and Environment

District Department of Energy and Environment released a report that identifies the likely impacts of climate change on the District of Columbia. It is the first step of a multi-phase project led by DOEE to develop a citywide climate adaptation and preparedness plan for the District. The climate change projections provided in the report will allow the District to assess its vulnerabilities and risks in the face of a changing climate and to identify strategies that will help the city adapt and prepare.
