 TPB agenda item 13 - Comments to US EPA and US DOT on The Safer Affordable Fuel Efficient (SAFE) Vehicles Proposed Rule for Model Years 2021-2026

The committee was informed that the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) are seeking comment on a proposed rule for model year 2021-2026 light duty vehicles through October 26, 2018. The rule recommends amending certain existing Corporate Average Fuel Economy (CAFE) and greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions standards for passenger cars and light trucks and keeping the model year 2020 standards in place for this time period. The board will also be briefed on the proposed rule, and asked to approve a joint TPB/MWAQC/CEEPC comment letter urging the EPA to stand by its January 12, 2017 Final Determination and maintain the existing GHG standards promulgated in 2012 (i.e., supporting the "Baseline/No-Action" alternative).

# RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT FROM THE TPB TECHNICAL COMMITTEE FOR THE LONG-RANGE TRANSPORTATION PLAN FOR THE NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION CALLED "VISUALIZE 2045"

WHEREAS, the Federal Planning Regulations of the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) implementing the FAST Act, which became effective June 27, 2016, specify the development and content of the long-range transportation plan and require that it be reviewed and updated at least every four years; and

**WHEREAS**, the Transportation Planning Board Bylaws call for the creation of a Technical Committee; and,

**WHEREAS**, the bylaws give the TPB Technical Committee the task of advising and assisting the TPB in the technical actions of the planning process, including: reviewing the cost and content of the work program, reviewing methodology and procedures, and reviewing plans and programs; and

WHEREAS, the Technical Committee makes recommendations to the TPB on numerous products and procedures to ensure coordination of procedures and standards between city, county, state and local planning agencies and the metropolitan transportation planning process, as governed by the provisions of the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act for developing and carrying out a continuing, cooperative and comprehensive transportation planning process for the Washington D.C. metropolitan area; and

**WHEREAS**, the bylaws provide the Technical Committee with the opportunity to consider and make recommendations concerning any other matters referred to it by the TPB; and

**WHEREAS**, the TPB has developed a plan called "Visualize 2045" that meets federal planning requirements, addresses the federal planning factors, will further goals in the TPB Vision and the Regional Transportation Priorities Plan, and includes a new "Aspirational Element" as specified by TPB Resolution R8-2018;

**WHEREAS**, the TPB Technical Committee has led the development and review process for this multi-year effort, by informing and providing guidance and technical expertise to staff for each element of Visualize 2045, by participating in and contributing to the expanded public outreach effort, and by helping to ensure that all federal regulations are followed and upheld; and

**WHEREAS**, the adoption of Visualize 2045 is scheduled for October 17, 2018 upon completion of a 30-day public comment period including interagency consultation on the results of the regional air quality conformity analysis of Visualize 2045 and the FY 2019-2024 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP);

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE TPB TECHNICAL COMMITTEE:

- Commends and expresses its appreciation to the TPB staff for their exhaustive efforts
  to produce a leading-edge plan that looks at the long-range transportation needs of
  the National Capital Region, including the District of Columbia and portions of
  Maryland and Virginia, called "Visualize 2045"; and
- 2. Recommends that the Transportation Planning Board approve Visualize 2045 at its October 17, 2018 board meeting.
