## 10:45 A.M. 4. SOLAR FOR ALL

The Inflation Reduction Act authorizes the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to make competitive grants under the Solar for All Program and authorized \$7 billion to the program. Solar for All will expand the number of low-income and disadvantaged communities primed for residential solar investment. On April 22, 2024, the Biden-Harris Administration announced Solar for All Awards including \$62.45 million to the District Department of Energy and Environment (DOEE), \$62.45 million to the Maryland Clean Energy

Center (MCEC), and \$156.12 million to the Virginia Department of Energy. Ms. Pimentel will provide an overview of the DOEE program and award.
