V. Updating the Regional Activity Center Map and Creating Complete Community Investment

The Planning Directors and Complete Community Team have begun the process to identify and update the Regional Activity Centers and to develop the complete community investment

typologies. The Activity Centers were developed as an outcome of the National Capital Region Transportation Planning Board (TPB) Vision report of 1998, and have evolved to become the focus of local and neighborhood reinvestment, and a key analytic tool for Region Forward's goals and targets. The first phase of the Activity Centers update involves working with local government planning departments to identify the appropriate centers; during the second phase this year, the Complete Communities team will survey the centers to create the investment typologies for development and infrastructure. Following up on last year's successful Complete Communities exercise, Coalition members will provide comments and direction on the Activity Centers.
