Item 3. EPA SIP Status Update

Presenter: Joan Rohlfs, Chief, Air Quality Planner

Description:

MWAQC approved and the States submitted State Implementation Plans for Ozone (2007) and the Fine Particle Standard (2008) to meet EPA's requirements for nonattainment areas. The deadline for attaining both standards was 2009. On July 29, 2009, EPA finalized its adequacy finding for the Washington D.C. 8-Hour Ozone nonattainment area 2008 RFP motor vehicle emissions budgets and declared them adequate for transportation conformity purposes. This is the only action EPA has taken on either SIP. The effect of EPA's inaction is to leave the Washington region with an ozone mobile budget for 2008 and no mobile budget for fine particles. Staff will report on the status of the SIPs.

Item 5. EPA Regulatory Actions for GHG Emissions

Presenter: Jeff King, Senior Environmental Planner

Description:

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Department of Transportation's National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) finalized a joint rule to establish a national program consisting of new standards for model year 2012 through 2016 light-duty vehicles that will reduce greenhouse gas emissions and improve fuel economy. EPA finalized the first-ever national greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions standards under the Clean Air Act, and NHTSA finalized Corporate Average Fuel Economy (CAFE) standards under the Energy Policy and Conservation Act. Staff will discuss these standards.
