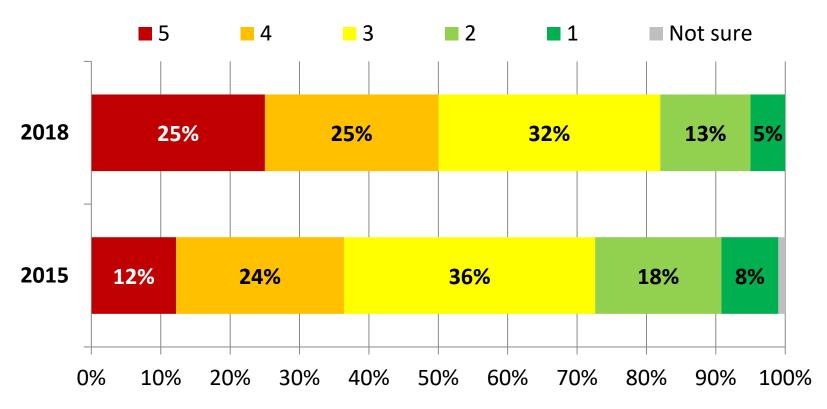

Who We Are

- Public-private partnership formed in 1995 and comprised of 30 organizations from:
 - Local governments (DC, MD, and VA)
 - State transportation and environmental agencies
 - Businesses and major employers
 - Advocacy groups (health, environmental, education, and transportation)
- Clean Air Partners was founded by COG and Baltimore Metropolitan Council (BMC) to
 - improve the Baltimore-Washington region's air quality and reduce greenhouse gas emissions through voluntary actions.
 - increase public awareness about the health effects of air quality.



Problem of Air Pollution

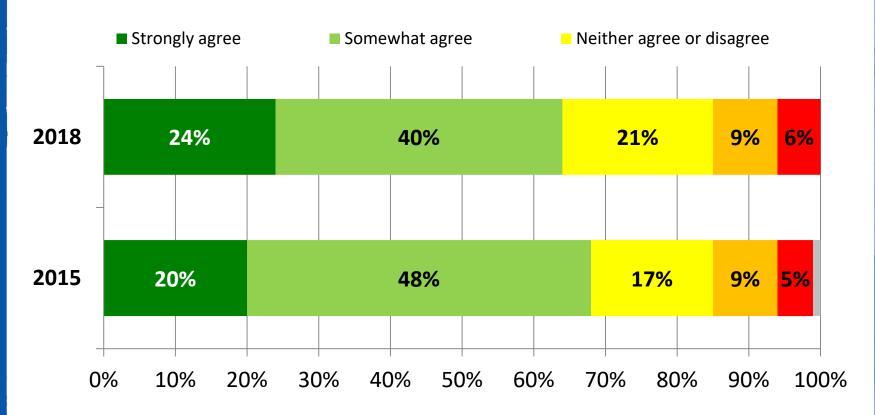

Radio and Transit Ads

- Partner with WMATA on their sustainability campaign

Schools and Summer Camps

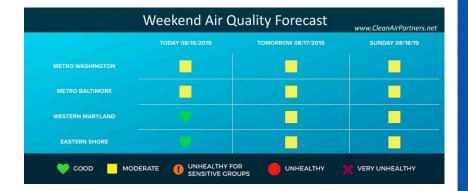
- Air quality and climate information presented to students each year.
- Reached tens of thousands young people through presentations at schools, events, camps, recreation centers, and summer youth job initiatives.

Collaboration with Air Quality Programs

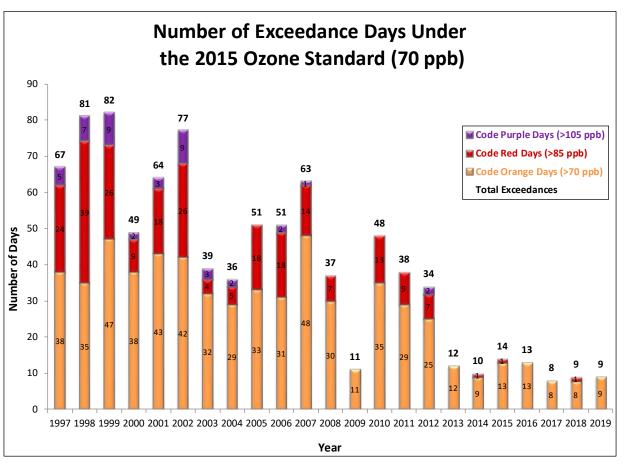
- Clean Air Partners works separately from, but collaborates with the Metropolitan Washington Air Quality Committee to help reach no unhealthy air days.
