Letter summary

- Rising risk levels with climate change
- Rising risk of wildfire smoke affecting region's air quality
- Letter's recommendations include:
 - Strengthen MWCOG emission reduction target, more aggressive mitigation and adaptation
 - MWCOG outreach to strengthen climate change reduction activities beyond existing policies

Letter summary, continued

- Recommendations, continued:
 - MWCOG communicates to its various stakeholders and partners the need for accelerated action on the climate crisis.
 - MWCOG's measurements, mitigation efforts, and resilience efforts concerning air quality should account for projected levels and duration of wildfire smoke in the coming years.

Addendum summary

- Geographic areas of focus for air quality. Account for cumulative health effects of poor air quality:
 - DC Wards 5, 7 and 8
 - Concentration of locally uwanted land uses:
 - coal-fired power plants in DC and Alexandria, VA
 - a "grandfathered" non-permitted industrial chemical use in Ivy City (northeast DC);
 - urban freeways such as Kenilworth Avenue NE and I-295 (DC Wards 7 and 8);

Addendum problem statement

- Addendum focuses on disadvantaged areas within COG region
- Geographic areas of focus for air quality. Account for cumulative health effects of poor air quality, continued:
 - DC Wards 5, 7 and 8
 - Concentration of locally unwanted land uses:
 - compressed natural gas (CNG) fueling stations such as the one proposed for the Shepherd Parkway Metrobus Garage in DC's Ward 8 (a potential source of methane leaks);
 - and industries that process road construction products (cement and asphalt plants).

Addendum recommendations

- Create database for atmospheric data gathering and pollution mitigation efforts to account for point, non-point pollution sources that affect disadvantages communities
 - Monthly reporting
- Within environmental justice action plan, incorporate procedures and resources needed to implement MWCOG's expedited environmental justice goals and objectives
- Involve MWCOG's Transportation Planning Board
