2016 National Capital Region Freight Plan

- Was a technical reference and a guide to future TPB planning activities
- Supported MAP-21 and FAST requirements
- Built on the 2010 edition
- Described the role of freight in the Region
- Defined a regional freight-significant network
- Described the drivers of freight demand and resulting freight flows
- Identified significant freight issues
- Included regional freight policies
- Identified projects that are important to goods movement
- Recommended future freight planning actions

- Progress tracking




ICF's Approach to the Plan Update

- Used 2016 Freight Plan as a starting point
- Conducted a literature review of regional freight plans (DDOT, MDOT, VDOT) and federal freight reports/policy guidance
- ICF and MWCOG Coordination
 - COG shared data and relevant documents
- Conducted a survey of TPB's Freight stakeholders in June 2022 to identify:
 - Key documents and initiatives to include in the literature scan
 - Key factors influencing freight and goods movement (long-term impacts)
 - The top freight challenges facing individual jurisdictions



What are the key factors influencing freight and goods movement within your jurisdiction or organization that you anticipate will have significant long-term impacts?








Interstate and Primary Highway Systems in the Region






Regionally Significant Highway Freight Network






Average Annual Daily Truck Traffic


