# How We Got Here... Governors and Mayor's Letter

- Governors and Mayor send letter to MWAQC initiating dialogue to reexamine regional air quality planning process for the Washington region.
- State Secretaries form working group to address changes in MWAQC

# How We Got Here... Dialogue: March - October

- Negotiations between State Secretaries group and MWAQC officers, Mar-Oct
- States' proposal discussed, modified
- Consensus to address MWAQC changes through bylaws
- Revision presented to MWAQC in Sept; amended and adopted in October

#### Where We Are...

 October 27, 2004 – MWAQC adopted the bylaws revisions by an overwhelming vote.

### Key Changes to MWAQC Process

- Creation of Cabinet Level Interstate Air Quality Council
- MWAQC Authority and Mission Clarified
- MWAQC TAC Chair State Air Official
- New Budget allocation
  - COG 1/3
  - State air agencies 1/3
  - State transportation agencies 1/3

### Interstate Air Quality Council

- Environment and Transportation Secretaries (MD-VA-DC)
- IAQC may transmit formal air quality proposals to MWAQC
- IAQC recommendations shall be given great weight.
- MWAQC plans submitted to IAQC
- MWAQC and IAQC jointly issue annual report

#### Additional Changes

- Membership Updated
  - Consistent with COG Board member/process
- Matters of Major Concern
  - Disclosure requirement
  - Revised DC quorum
- Electronic meeting participation permitted

#### Where We Go Next...

- Interstate Air Quality Council formalized by Governors and Mayor
- Governors and Mayor formally announce IAQC and MWAQC Process with MWAQC/COG Leadership
- Active Planning for 8 hour standard continues
- Planning initiated for new particle standard
