RESOLUTION ON AMENDMENT TO THE FY 2006-2011 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP) THAT IS EXEMPT FROM THE AIR QUALITY CONFORMITY REQUIREMENT TO INCLUDE FUNDING FOR A DISTRICT-WIDE INTELLIGENT TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM (ITS) PROJECT AND A BASE REALIGNMENT COMMISSION (BRAC) / ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT STUDY AS REQUESTED BY THE VIRGINIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (VDOT)

WHEREAS, the National Capital Region Transportation Planning Board (TPB), which is the metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for the Washington Region, has the responsibility under the provisions of the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, and Efficient Transportation Equity Act - A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) for developing and carrying out a continuing, cooperative and comprehensive transportation planning process for the Metropolitan Area; and

**WHEREAS,** on October 19, 2005 the TPB adopted the 2005 CLRP and the FY 2006-2011 TIP; and

**WHEREAS**, in the attached letter of September 14, 2006, VDOT has requested that the FY 2006-2011 TIP be amended to include \$4.6 million of federal Interstate Maintenance funding for a district-wide ITS project and \$400,000 of advance construction of National Highway System funding for a BRAC/Economic Development study as described in the attached materials; and

**WHEREAS**, these projects are exempt from the air quality conformity requirement, as defined as defined in Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulations "40 CFR Parts 51 and 93 Transportation Conformity Rule Amendments: Flexibility and Streamlining; Final Rule," issued in the May 6, 2005, *Federal Register*,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION TRANSPORTATION PLANNING BOARD amends the FY 2006-2011 TIP to include \$4.6 million of federal Interstate Maintenance funding for a district-wide ITS project and \$400,000 of advance construction of National Highway System funding for a BRAC/Economic Development study, as described in the attached materials.

VDOT's Northern Virginia District Office requests amending the FY 2006-2011 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to add funding that has become available after the TPB meeting agenda was finalized. The requested amendment will add a District-wide ITS project and a BRAC/Economic Development effort, and enable the Commonwealth to obligate these additional FY06 funds that were recently provided by the Federal Highway Administration.

#### District-wide ITS Project

NoVA District plans to implement integrated corridor management strategies to expand the ITS technology to the primary system as well as the Interstate system. The envisioned integrated (Interstate and primary) corridor management strategies would improve the safety and efficiency of travel which is highly dependent upon the adequacy, placement, and reliability of the ITS field equipment. Examples of ITS technology are CCTV, variable message signs (VMS), conditional monitoring data collection (e.g. sensor), etc. The purpose of these strategies is to monitor corridor traffic conditions, more quickly detect and respond to incidents, and inform travelers of the corridor conditions. A strategic ITS assessment was completed in January, 2006, which identified the need to expand the ITS systems over the next several years to primary routes that will be selected based on several criteria, such as current traffic conditions, future traffic volumes, high accident locations, 511 coverage, evacuation routes, and so forth. This bonus Federal funding will allow VDOT staff to start identifying and implementing ITS

technologies along the highest priority corridors. This project currently exists in the TIP, though with significantly less funding. The project is categorically exempt from air quality conformity analysis.

#### • BRAC / Economic Development Project

The proposed BRAC / Economic Development project will provide funding to support VDOT coordination with BRAC boards and consultants, participate in BRAC-related coordination meetings, and develop a regional traffic impact analysis based on proposed Base Realignment Commission (BRAC) recommendations. This is a new TIP project. As a coordination / study / travel forecasting effort, this project is categorically exempt from air quality conformity analysis.
