Citizens will also have a chance to hear about the financial outlook for the region's long-range transportation plan (2014-2040).. *BACKGROUND:* The TIP is a federally required document that lists transportation projects throughout the Metropolitan Washington Region that are scheduled to be funded over the next six years. At the CAC meeting on September 11, the TIP will be released for a 30-day public comment period. The Transportation Planning Board is scheduled to approve the TIP on October 15.
