Background

- In October, TPB amended the CLRP/TIP to include the CapCom regional transportation coordination program
 - Grant funding in SAFETEA-LU from Congressman Moran
 - Match provided equally by DDOT, MDOT, and VDOT
- Those agencies plus WMATA working as a Steering Committee to address the program
- Through DDOT, engaged the USDOT Volpe Center research staff to develop a strategic plan, business process, functionality, and initial work plan for CapCom
 - Four-month study now drawing to a close



Accomplished to Date

- Site visits of current TMC Operations with all partner agencies
- Convened TMC key operations personnel
 - 3 four-hour work sessions in November
 - Developed basis for Concept of Operation for CapCom: the way regional transportation incident operations should fit together
 - Helped achieve buy-in of key staff without whom a regional program cannot succeed
- Developed draft Mission Needs Statement and Concept of Operations



Findings

- Assessment of best practices revealed more could be done on a regional basis:
 - Regional incidents done on an ad hoc basis
 - Effective institutional arrangements missing for regional standard operating procedures
 - Staff-to-staff contact to build trust and credibility
 - Data and communications links are missing
 - More travel forecast information for the public
 - Joint planning and operations for known special events, weather-related events, and other incident scenarios
- No regional point-person for program management
- A business problem, not a technical problem



Mission Needs Statement and Concept of Operations

- Drafted by Volpe in conjunction with the Steering Committee to guide CapCom development
- Mission Needs Statement
 - Defines the explicit role for CapCom
 - High-level overview of regional incident management capabilities, including current capabilities, current shortfalls and their impacts, as well as future capabilities
 - Represents the shared understanding of the program partners (VDOT, MDOT, DDOT, WMATA, and COG/TPB)
- Concept of Operations
 - Defines CapCom's key features and functional capabilities
 - Defines organizational alternatives and recommends a CapCom Regional Incident Coordination Program be incorporated into current TMC operations with a CapCom Program Manager

Examine Regional Incident Performance

- Establishes agreements and business practices among the partners for regional incidents
- Defines pre-planned responses depending on the incident
- Develop forecasting capability to determine primary and secondary impacts of an incident
- Continual updates and refinements based on training and lessons learned
- Measuring incident management performance

Coordinate with Regional ITS Architecture

- CapCom Information Systems functions will implement a regional system to compile, fuse, tailor and distribute regional transportation data (RITIS)
- CapCom will coordinate system development with the regional ITS architecture and individual agency IT development



Recommendations Based on the Volpe Study

- Form CapCom as a regional program that is integrated within existing partner agency TMC's and:
 - Use the COG/TPB structure to contract for a dedicated Program Manager
 - Works closely with the partner agencies to identify best ways to implement CapCom consistent with the Concept of Operations
 - Oversees the development of an optimal organization structure, technical systems and regional standard operating procedures
 - Enables regional transportation coordination and accurate and timely information dissemination during incidents
 - Ensures regional accountability
- Continue agency-by-agency efforts to better regional coordination through regional standard operation procedures
