11:30 A.M. 4. COG BOARD RESOLUTION ON REGIONAL CLIMATE GOALS
Steve Walz, COG Environmental Director

Currently the regional climate goals include a 20 percent reduction in GHG emissions by 2020 (below 2005 levels) and 80 percent by 2050. The proposed new mitigation goals include 50 percent by 2050 and carbon neutrality and new resilience goals of becoming a Climate Ready Region by 2030 and fully Climate Resilient Region by 2050. The COG Board must adopt the proposed new goals if they are to be included in the 2030 Regional Climate and Energy Action Plan.
