Greenhouse Gas, Mitigation, and Resiliency Services RFP

Through a competitive procurement process, the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments (COG) has issued contracts to ICF International and Cadmus to assist COG's Department of Environmental Programs (DEP), as well as COG member governments and other regional stakeholders in responding to the challenges of addressing emissions of greenhouse gases (GHGs) and climate change. The scope of services includes greenhouse inventories and climate action planning support, support for implementation of mitigation measures, and support for climate resilience activities. US EPA Diesel Emission Reduction Act Funding Assistance Opportunity

U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has opened its next round of Diesel Emission Reduction Act (DERA) funding opportunities. COG is seeking partners to propose projects to reduce emissions from diesels vehicles. Eligible projects can include vehicle replacement, engine repowers, diesel particulate filters for both on and off-road vehicles. COG is currently repowering switcher locomotives at Union Station and marine passenger vessels operating on the Potomac River. Proposals are due March 6, 2019. The Maryland and Virginia Program to Facilitate LED Streetlighting Conversion by Local Governments is a U.S. Department of Energy grant funded project. The project team is led by the Maryland Energy Administration and the team includes Virginia Department of Mines, Minerals, and Energy (VA DMME), Clean Energy Solutions Inc, National Association of State Energy Offices, Northern Virginia Regional Commission, and COG. The project will involve providing technical support to local jurisdictions in their efforts to convert existing streetlights to more efficient LED technology. Fleets for the Future (F4F) Project

F4F is a U.S. DOE-funded effort to develop and implement procurement processes that will coordinate and consolidate bulk orders of advanced fueled vehicles, alternative fuels, and refueling and charging infrastructure for public sector fleets. As part of this effort, COG, in partnership with the National Association of Regional Councils (NARC) and four other regional councils, worked towards reducing incremental costs of commercially available alternative fuel vehicles and infrastructure.

COG awarded contracts to three vendors for bulk purchases of 16 types of alternative vehicles, including all electric and plug-in hybrid electric vehicles. Five best practice guides were developed, which include: GUIDE to the Guides - Municipal EV Charging Resources, Gaseous Fuel Vehicle Procurement Best Practices Guide, Electric Vehicle Procurement Best Practices Guide, Guide to

COG Hosts Montgomery County Green Bank Workshop

On November 16, 2018, COG hosted the Montgomery County Greenbank's Thinking Local: A Follow-Up to the "Benefits of a Green Bank for your Community" workshop. The workshop was intended to continue the conversation started by the original group of green bank practitioners and local county/government officials in attendance from Maryland, Virginia and Washington, DC about the green bank model, best practices and how those can be applied at the local level. There were discussion sessions on several topics including: Commercial Property Assessed Clean Energy (C-PACE), affordable rental, community solar, single-family homeowner, commercial loan for energy efficiency and renewables, single-family solar and storage, EVs and micro grids. A potential outcome of the event is reviving the COG Regional PACE Work Group into a Clean Energy Finance Work Group.
