11:25 A.M. 5. TRANSPORTATION PLANNING BOARD (TPB) CLIMATE CHANGE MITIGATION STUDY OF 2021

The goal of this study is to demonstrate potential pathways for the region to reduce on-road transportation sector GHG emissions to meet regional GHG reduction goals in 2030 and 2050. The study is divided into two phases: Phase 1, conducted by TPB staff, is a summary of major findings from past work done in this area by TPB and COG. Phase 2 is a technical analysis conducted by a consultant. At today's meeting, TPB staff will summarize the findings of the Phase 1 report that will be used as reference for Phase 2 of the study.
