10:45 6. Economic benefit of Metrorail and VRE to the state of Virginia

Dan Goldfarb, Northern Virginia Transportation Commission
In November 2016, NVTC's Chairman requested staff to scope out a study to
evaluate the economic value of high-capacity transit in Northern Virginia to the
Commonwealth of Virginia. The objective of the study was to quantify the value
and worth that commuter and heavy rail operating in Northern Virginia bring to
the Commonwealth. This study differed from previous and current work as it

would look beyond property tax revenue to those revenues that were assessed at the state level. NVTC's effort also differed in that it used the regional travel demand forecast model to evaluate different network and land use scenarios and the corresponding impact on the transportation network.

11:15 7. National Capital Region Federal Parking Study: An Accessibility-Based Approach for Federal Facilities Parking Policies

Kael Anderson, National Capital Planning Commission NCPC's parking policies constrain the amount of vehicular traffic to federal facilities as a means of attaining environmental and planning-related goals. This study, completed by the Volpe National Transportation Center recommended new standards. NCPC is inviting feedback, in anticipation of revising its transportation policies.

The Transportation Research Board (TRB) held its 97th Annual Meeting from January 7-11, 2018 in Washington, D.C.
