#### **Northern Virginia District Background**

- Fairfax, Loudoun, Prince William, and Arlington\* \* Arlington maintains own network (secondary roads)
- Population: 2.2 million
- Commuter lots: 24
- Bridges/large culverts: 2,000
- Traffic signals: 1,400
- VDOT employees: 866




#### Total lanes miles: 14,025

- Anti-icing treatment most effective during first hour of weather event
- **Reduces bonding** to asphalt and concrete surfaces
- Piloting brine treatments during storms when conditions are favorable

Depending upon the storm and the window of time, we may perform a **partial or full treatment of all bridges**, **overpasses**, **elevated surfaces**, **primary and/or secondary roads**.







Crews work interstates, major roads and main subdivision roads in priority order.

Passable lane goals:

- 2-4" of snow: 24 hours
- 4-6" of snow: 48 hours
- 6"+ of snow: 72+ hours

#### Additional priorities:

- Getting the roadways as safe as possible
- Shoulders, ramps, turn lanes, intersections
- 12,000 park-and-ride spaces

#### **Sidewalks and Trails**

- Crews asked to be mindful, but often limited room to pile snow from roads
- Special care is requested near schools and emergency facilities
- Residents and businesses are asked to clear near their property
- Check with localities for ordinances



#### VDEQ Salt Management Strategy (SaMS)


- Since Jan. 2018, VDOT has participated in the Salt Management Strategy (SaMS) development coordinated by the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality (VDEQ)
- Stakeholders working to balance public safety and impacts of salt use
- Aims to raise awareness of salt use; share how individuals, businesses, and organizations can participate; and provide voluntary guidance for potential monitoring and research
- Plan will be under development through 2020/21.





#### **Partnership with Waze**

VDOT's Office of Strategic Innovation is working to evaluate the use of crowdsourced data during snow events, specifically using features available through Waze.

In Northern Virginia, VDOT plans to work with several targeted neighborhoods this winter on a hyperlocal pilot to monitor and document local observations via Waze, and evaluate how best this information can be incorporated into operations monitoring.

#### Work During COVID-19

- Safety is always top priority
- Close monitoring and adjustments to minimize impacts to employees and customers
- Focused on the customers we serve, our workforce and maintaining access to critical supplies needed to help keep Virginia moving
- Visitors by appointment (no walk-ins) for permits and public needs
- Social distancing required in all work environments
- Employees must telework when/if able; leverage technology and alternatives to in-person meetings
- Enhanced cleaning of vehicles/facilities
- Employee procedures in event of personal exposure or symptoms

#### **VDOT COVID-19 Winter Weather Operations**

- The safety of the traveling public and of the agency's employees and partners is always top priority.
- To help protect agency employees and partners, we are implementing new Virginia Department of Health COVID-19 safety protocols for equipment operator transfers.
- Procedures and training have been updated to conduct winter operations with minimal contact or contactless interactions through all stages.
- While these additional precautions may increase the driver exchange timeline, crews will continue to work around the clock, as needed, in response to snow and ice events aligned with current practice.

#### **Current Local Traffic Trends**

- Traffic volume trajectory has plateaued since uptick in early summer
- Interstates at ~92% daily volume level, except I-66 inside the Beltway (~60%)
- Primary roads at 75-85% daily volume level compared to pre-COVID
- Least volume growth on roads servicing highest federal employment areas
- Observing weekday PM peak traffic higher than AM peak, suggesting trips/errands after teleworking/virtual learning.
- Signal Operations Center (SOC) continues to monitor/adjust signal timing, particularly evening peak growth.
