Columbia Pike Initiative Plan

Arlington County's plan for the 3.5 mile long Columbia Pike corridor incorporates 25 action steps including transportation, land use, housing, and infrastructure improvements to be undertaken to revitalize this once vibrant "main street". A key implementation tool is the Form Based Code, which was adopted in 2003. The Code ensures that streets and public spaces achieve a desired pedestrian-friendly form and character through design and placement requirements defined in the Code. The Code, which incorporates new urbanist principles, calls for one million square feet of mixed-use development to built within four activity nodes. The Code requires buildings to be built close to the street, defining public vs. private space, and requires parking to be either underground or at the rear of properties. The Code promotes shared parking through the use of innovative parking strategies and eases walkability by limiting curb cuts and superblock development. Arlington's Code also acknowledges and preserves the existing historic character of the corridor.
