## CHESAPEAKE BAY TMDL: PLANNING TARGETS AND PHASE III WIPS

- Positives:
  - o Good science in revised model
  - o Preservation of time in the schedule for adequate draft WIP review
- Don't add new reporting requirements when others, such as MS4 annual reports, can provide the needed information
- Continue to address issues of affordability/maximum extent practicable as part of adaptive management efforts
- Plans for addressing the additional loads
  - o Conowingo Dam
    - How will nutrient credits for Conowingo WIP be distinguished from Phase III WIPs?
    - Note wastewater and stormwater accomplishments and maximum level of feasibility
      - Preserve wastewater capacity in nutrient trading
  - o Climate change
    - How will gaps in science be addressed in preparations for 2022 numeric milestones?
    - Discuss feasibility

## ADDITIONAL LOCAL WATER QUALITY FOCUS AREAS FOR METROPOLITAN WASHINGTON

- Toxics (PCBs, PAHs, others)
- Salts/chlorides impacts to local waterways and drinking water
- Water infrastructure needs increased investment
