A cross-section of procurement stakeholders representing all commodity groups as well as officials from schools, UDC, Public Works, Transportation, and Environment. Membership remains open!







- ✓ Improve communication with vendors.




Goal: To create jurisdiction-wide Green specifications that have been vetted for price, performance, environmental sufficiency, and political realities.
