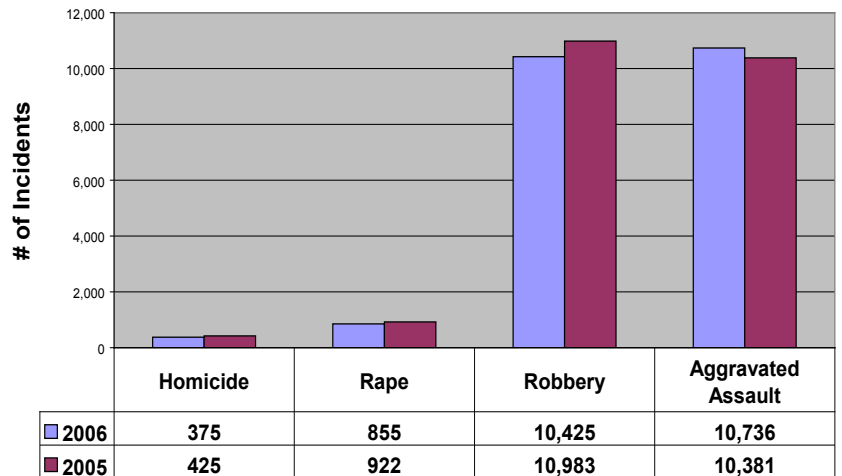

# Overview

The 2006 COG Report on Crime, representing crime incidents reported by participating agencies within the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments, provides a snapshot of the Part I crimes occurring within the National Capital Region. Part I crimes include murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny and vehicle theft. Violent crime, which includes murder, rape, robbery and aggravated assault, is also a focus of this report.

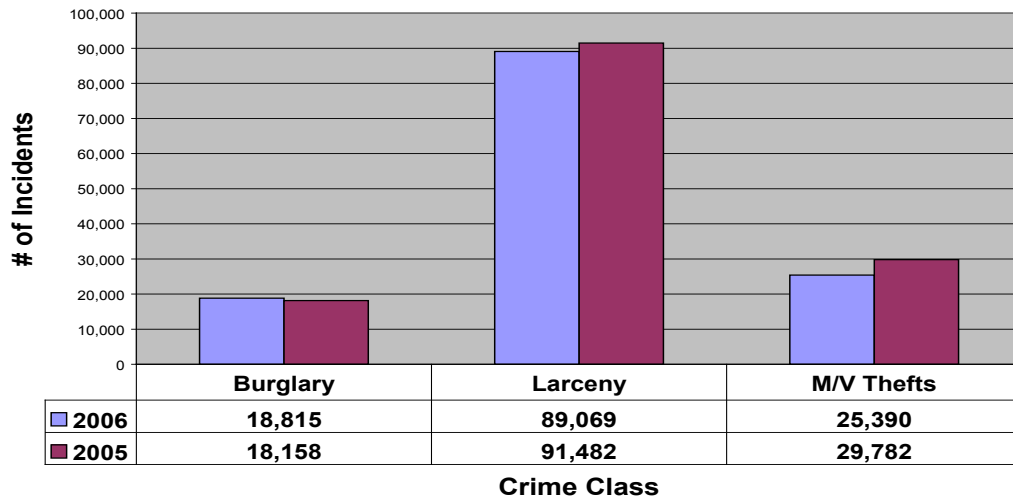
Overall, when comparing regional crime figures of 2006 to those of 2005, Part I crimes are down 4.0%, largely due to significant decreases in murders (-11.8%) and motor vehicle thefts (-14.7%). Other decreases included rape (-7.3%), robbery (-5.1%) and larceny (-2.6%). Analysis of violent crime in the region reveals a -1.4% decrease, overall.

## Violent Crime



*The data highlighted in this report is compiled annually by the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments (COG) from the data supplied by local police departments, sheriffs' offices, and state and federal police services. The report informs government officials and the public on the nature of the crime problem in the COG region and provides law enforcement with criminal statistics for administrative and operational use.*

## Property Crime



Based on the preliminary estimates, released by the FBI, the COG region continues to compare well with the national crime rate. FBI estimates\*\* suggest a 1.35% increase in violent crime, while Part I property crimes showed a 2.9% decrease. In the COG region, violent crime was down 1.4% and Part I property crime was down 4.4%, respectively.

The decrease in crime within the COG region is good news, brought on largely by significant decreases in all Part I crimes by the Prince Georges County Police Department. Regional data sharing combined with effective border initiatives and inter-agency cooperation have assisted in the successful outcomes. Beneath the ‘good news’ statistics, however, there is still evidence of a growing robbery problem throughout our region. Members of COG must continue to facilitate the use of emerging technology and inter-agency cooperation to maintain our high standards of public safety.



*\*\* The FBI 2006 crime figures are published in October 2007 and currently provide only six months (January - June 2006) of estimated compared figures. A comparison with the annual COG report must be considered in context and should not be interpreted as conclusive.*

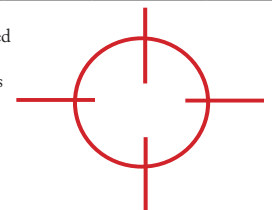

- Reporting methods are not uniform throughout this report since some departments used the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) while others used the National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS). Recognizing the need for additional information about crime, the FBI launched NIBRS as an enhanced UCR Program. The FBI discovered that conversion to the new system would be gradual, so it is appropriate for agencies to still report under UCR. NIBRS crime rates tend to be higher than UCR rates, primarily because NIBRS statistically counts all separate violations within a single criminal event. UCR counts only the most serious crime. The average difference, however, is small.
- For some departments, only partial data or no data at all was collected. The CIA and U.S. Secret Service did not provide data for this report. Data for Bowie, College Park, Gaithersburg, Rockville, and the U.S. Capitol Police was reported via another department. These figures are italicized.
- Crimes Per 1000 = Crimes per 1,000 residents

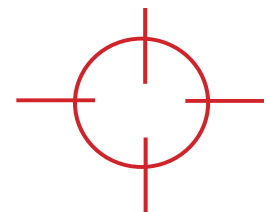

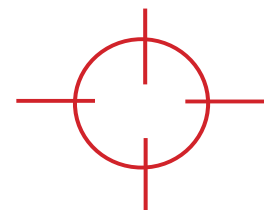
