Dominion Virginia Power Solar-Power Demonstration Project</b> This past November, the Virginia SCC approved Dominion’s request to set up a pilot solar-energy generation program. The purpose of the pilot is to assess the benefits that solar generation could have for the Dominion’s distribution system.
