

Prince George's County's Curbside Food Scrap Collection Pilot



 Since December of 2017 Prince George's County has been piloting curbside collection of food scraps in a one year EPA grant funded project, to determine best practices



- Participants from Pepper Mill/Carmody Hills, Wilburn, parts of Tantallon/Fort Washington and West Laurel
- Collection components include a 32 gallon wheeled cart, a kitchen bin, a one time supply of compostable liners, a How To Guide and Frequently Asked Questions, (FAQ's)







Acceptable Items




- The average pounds per household collected in the original pilot areas is approximately 5 - 7 pounds per week
- Food scraps collected separately from yard trim
- West Laurel Started in July 2018;
 materials were collected by Recycling
 Section staff for the first two months







- Approximately 75 out of 200 households participating on a regular basis
- West Laurel's food scrap tonnage is significantly higher than that of the other areas.
 Approximately 14.5 pound per week per household



 Material is now collected by the contractor on Mondays and combined in the truck with yard trim.







- A survey will be sent to participants
- Requesting feed back on participants experiences
- Frequency of participation
- Recommendations for improvement








Recycling and Diversion Rate
