

### PBPP Rulemaking: Public Transportation Agency Safety Plans rule – Expected in February 2018



- The National Public Transportation Safety Plan final rule finalized the transit safety performance measures.
- The Public Transportation Agency Safety Plan, which will specify the transit safety target-setting process and timeline, is still pending. (Draft: 2/15/16)



# **PBPP - Transit Asset Management (TAM)**

- The Transportation Planning Board adopted initial TAM targets for the region at its June 21, 2017 meeting.
- Starting <u>October 2017</u>: Providers of public transportation report performance data and targets in the National Transit Database (NTD) within four months after their fiscal year end:
  - Optional reporting for this year, e.g., FY 2017 data and FY 2018 targets due October 31, 2017 (if fiscal year July-June).
  - Mandatory reporting for future years, e.g., FY 2018 data and FY 2019 targets by October 31, 2018 (if fiscal year July-June).
- Only WMATA establishing FY 2018 targets. No others did.
- TPB will next establish TAM targets in September/October 2018, as part of Visualize 2045 long range plan and FY2019-2024 TIP approval.



## FY 2018 – TPB Transit Planning Activities

- 2045 Visualize Long Range Plan
  - Funded component
  - Unfunded component (Long Range Plan Task Force)
    - Collecting TDPs and include transit improvements into Unfunded Projects list.
- State of Public Transportation Report
- Transit Asset and Transit Safety PBPP
- RPTS Meetings

  - Issues discussed at RPTS: customer info, maintenance facilities, downtown staging needs (bus and rail), technology integration, etc.
