



### **Economic Impacts**

### Washington, D.C.

Production, Distribution, Grocery, Restaurants, & Support Industries <sup>1</sup>

\$5.47 billion total value added economic impact

### Maryland (COG Localities)

Agriculture, Forestry, Aquaculture, & Support Industries <sup>2</sup>

\$2.9 billion in economic impact

### Virginia (COG Localities)

Agriculture & Forestry <sup>3</sup> \$2.23 billion in economic impact








### Food and Agriculture in our Region
