

Child Nutrition Reauthorization

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Keep Kids Fed Act



- Extends USDA's authority to issue summer nutrition waivers through September 30, 2022; meal pattern waivers through June 30, 2022, and non-cost nationwide waivers through school year 2022–2023
- Increases reimbursements: school breakfast by \$0.15 cents, school lunch by \$0.40 cents, and CACFP by \$0.10
- Extends the area eligibility waiver allowing family child care homes to receive the higher Tier 1 reimbursements

Healthy Meals, Healthy Kids Act



- FRAC strongly supports
- Bill is advancing to House floor
 - Approved by House Committee on Education and Labor on July 27th
- Will dramatically increase children's access to federal nutrition programs and reduce administrative challenges



Community Eligibility Provisions



- Expands CEP, allowing more schools to offer free meals to all students
- Multiplier raised from 1.6 to 2.5
- Lowers eligibility threshold from 40% ISP to 25% ISP
- Creates statewide CEP option



School Meals

Reimbursement Rates

- Increases free, reduced-price, and paid lunch reimbursement rates by 10 cents
- Adds 6 cents in commodities for school breakfasts

Eligibility

- Allows Medicaid direct certification for free and reduced-price school meals
- Makes kids retroactively eligible to the start of the school year





Unpaid School Meal Fees

- Prohibits overt identification of students whose households have unpaid school meal fees including disposal of a child's food
- Requires schools to take steps to determine if students whose households have unpaid meal fees are eligible for free or reduced-price school meals
- Sets parameters for the collection of unpaid school meal fees
- Creates an Unpaid Meal Debt National Advisory Council
