12:45 P.M. 3. TRANSPORTATION-LAND USE CONNECTIONS PROGRAM (TLC) – DESIGNING STREETS FOR PEOPLE WITH VISION DISABILITIES

The committee will be briefed on MCDOT's *Planning and Designing Streets to be* Safer and More Accessible for People with Vision Disabilities toolkit, developed with a TLC technical assistance grant. The toolkit helps better engage people with vision disabilities in the planning and design process, identifies issues with current roadway and sidewalk designs, and recommends ways to make roads and sidewalks easier and safer to navigate.
