TPB Reception of Staff Recommendations

- Very supporting in general of the recommendation to adopt a resolution in four parts:
 - Part 1: Urge members to prioritize increasing seat belt use, and reducing speeding, impaired driving, and distracted driving
 - Part 2: Urge members to implement the 50+ recommended countermeasures
 - Part 3: Establish and fund a Regional Safety Program
 - Part 4: Call on local members to adopt equitable Vision Zero policies and develop local roadway safety plans – call on member states to adopt primary seat belt legislation, and increase the use of ignition interlock devices
- Member discussion focused on equity
 - Chair Russell's equity statement
 - Discussion of enforcement provisions

Regional Safety Program

- Regional Safety Program is Authorized and Funded
- Developing the Program
 - \$250k per year
 - Loosely modeled on the Transportation Land-Use Connections Program
 - Start with a "pilot"
 - Purpose is "to assist its member jurisdictions and the region to develop and/or implement projects, programs or policies to equitably improve safety outcomes for all roadway users."



Regional Safety Program

TPB Regional Safety Program - Potentail Types of Projects

- Assist jurisdictions with crash data analysis
- Provide consultant services to facilitate local road safety audits
- Support additional "Street Smart-like" activities with street teams and Virtual Reality car for member jurisdictions
- Support more sobriety checkpoints
- Support or sponsor a regional "safest driver" contest (along the lines of what San Antonio did in 2018)
- Support jurisdictional level roadway safety plans
- Facilitate/conduct regional safety peer exchanges and/or training programs
- Facilitate educational outreach on safety



Next Steps

- Develop the Regional Safety Program pilot
 - Internal discussions with senior leadership
 - Outreach to state DOTs and member jurisdictions
- Develop post-pilot structure of the Regional Safety Program



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
