The Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments and ULI Washington are partnering to offer Technical Assistance Panels focused on identifying priority, catalytic strategies to maximize the impact of investments in Activity Centers. A Technical Assistance Panel (TAP) is a program where 10-12 senior-level real estate and land use experts work over a concentrated timeline to evaluate and provide market-based feedback on a local development or land use challenge. Depending on the issues being tackled, panelists may include developers, property owners/managers, investors, designers, planners, engineers, market and financial analysts, and public sector planners and officials. The panel takes place over a oneand-one-half day timeline, with a report of recommendations completed thereafter.

Update on the WMATA Capital Needs Early Warning System Database Request

Michael Eichler of WMATA will brief the Committee on a proposed new WMATA GIS project request for local government permitting data. The purpose of the project is to build an updatable Graphical Information System (GIS)-based tool summarizing known planned, proposed, and pipeline real estate development projects located within the WMATA Compact jurisdictions. This tool will be used to inform Metro's understanding of potential Metrorail system pressures that may evolve in a near-term (1-10 years) planning horizon.

At the October 15 meeting, the TPB was briefed on an October 9 letter from MWAQC and CEEPC requesting that the TPB affirm support for the 2008 COG greenhouse gas reduction goals. The letter also informed the TPB that the two committees have asked COG to convene a multi-sector, multi-disciplinary professional working group to explore establishing a target for screening the regional transportation plan, based upon the COG greenhouse gas reduction goals. The Committee will be briefed on a proposed TPB resolution to affirm support for the greenhouse emission reduction goals. It will also be briefed on COG actions to establish this working group.

Project Briefing on PRESTO: Plan for Regional Sustainability Tomorrow

The multi-year goal for this project is to develop, disseminate, and promote the implementation of a sustainable development strategy for the Baltimore-Washington region. Well known examples of similar efforts include privately financed and promoted plans such as the Burnham plan for Chicago, the Wallace-McHarg plan for the Valleys, and the series of plans for greater metropolitan New York prepared by the Regional Planning Association. These plans or strategies were not prepared for or adopted by any public agency but were highly influential for decades after they were released. The first-year goal for the project is to stimulate a science-based conversation about sustainability in this region and to develop one or more baseline scenarios
