HOT Lanes and Other Major Projects Move Closer to CLRP

Members of the National Capital Region Transportation Planning Board (TPB) voted at the March meeting to include projects such as the I-395/I-95 HOV and HOT lanes project in Northern Virginia in an air quality analysis of the region's long range transportation plan, a necessary prerequisite for the projects to be included in the Financially Constrained Long Range Transportation Plan (CLRP). The vote was covered by WTOP and the *Washington Examiner*.

For the second month in a row, response to the January 26 snowstorm continued to generate a lot of coverage in the media.
