
Overview of Roadway Safety Program

Roadway safety has been a long-standing TPB priority

- 1998 TPB Vision, and those of subsequent documents, included a regional transportation system that maximized the safety of all modes as a goal
- Regional focus on safety sharpened in 2018 after data analyses showed roadway fatalities increasing
 - TPB adopted Resolution R3-2021 in 2020, which re-affirmed roadway safety as a priority and urged safety measures to be implemented in a non-racist way
- Increases in traffic fatalities has accelerated since 2020








Information and Data Analysis

The TPB pursues data analysis and performance evaluation to inform TPB decision-making

- Regional roadway safety studies
- Annual roadway safety performance evaluation and target setting

Safety Programs

The Regional Roadway Safety Program and Street Smart Campaign are two COG/TPB safety initiatives

- Regional Roadway Safety Program provides short-term, technical assistance grants for roadway safety improvement projects in the region
- Street Smart uses creative radio and television advertising to encourage safe travel behaviors among drivers, pedestrians and bicyclists
