BILL IDENTIFICATION:

PURPOSE OF BILL:

This study charges the DOT to create a detailed analysis on the operating and continued maintenance needs of Metro; to review how transit services across the country are funded; and to identify State funding strategies to take advantage of potential new federal funding for WMATA. It will be led by a Transit Funding Steering Committee comprised of:

- 3 Members of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate
- 3 Members of the House appointed by the Speaker of the House
 - o Hixson (Mont.), Bohanon (St. Mary's), Goodwin (Balt. City)*
- Secretary of Transportation, or his designee
- Secretary of Management and Budget, or his designee

Once the study begins, a report shall be submitted to the General Assembly on or before December 15, 2006.

REGIONAL IMPACT: While this bill does not dedicate funding for Metro it is a step in the right direction and should be acceptable for keeping the federal funding in play.

RELATIONSHIP TO COG STRATEGIC PLAN/EXISTING COG POLICIES: Follows the COG adopted policies on Metro funding.

RELATED LEGISLATION: VIRGINIA BUDGET

A budget has yet to be adopted in Virginia; negotiations are still underway specifically in the area of capital expenditures where some current transportation needs may be considered. Major transportation funding, including long-term funding, have been removed from the budget and have been set aside for later negotiations; House and Senate proposals for transportation amounts are significantly different.
