



Task Force Recommendation: REDS



Problem Statement: The DMV lags in overall economic competitiveness nationally despite our wealth of talent, institutions, access, and assets. Our region's economic development has been constrained by geopolitical divisions, limited coordination, and socioeconomic inequalities.

Recommendation: To develop a Regional Economic Development Strategy for integrated, equitable, and transparent economic renewal across the DMV

Summary: Commission a six-month Working Group to:

- Establish clear scope, outcomes, measurements and process for a regional economic development strategy
- Answer to a Steering Committee of regional public-private economic development leaders
- Develop priorities for enhancing regional strengths, attracting new industries, and advancing regional cooperation
- Partner with regional EDAs / EDCs, Planning Departments, MWCOG, Board of Trade, WMATA, Regional Orgs, Industry & Community
- Publish REDS version 1.0 in Spring 2021

Benefits & Value

- Illuminates regional aspects of economic equity, resilience, and growth
- Clarifies our regional challenges, strengths, and opportunities
- Enables the DMV to identify targeted reforms and improve competitiveness
- Highlights potential areas, initiatives, and mechanisms for DMV collaboration
- Increases public-private cooperation and investment
- Launches an ongoing process whereby jurisdictional plans are coordinated and benefit from a larger regional plan
- Improves decision-making by increasing transparency of initiatives and benefits



REDS 1.0 Target Outcomes



REDS 1.0 Mission: To establish a regional alliance that provides a cross-jurisdictional platform, with active industry and academia participation, to enhance cooperation, communication, and collaboration for equitable economic development across the DMV


Lay the groundwork for collaboration between the regional economic development, planning, and governance functions in the public sector; and partner with academia, industry, and investment to increase opportunity for all and lift the regional economy

Identify shared interests, complementary resources, and opportunities for partnership

Deliver an actionable strategy to guide regional economic development efforts on a continuing basis

Build a base (REDS 1.0) that can be sustained and grown over time

Design and secure commitments for initial collaborations in areas such as talent development, workforce enablement, jobs creation, market strengthening and activation, and an innovation ecosystem



REDS 1.0 Scope & Phased Approach



I. Research & Discovery

A. Explore successful **regional collaboration models** (US/global)
B. Identify **successful regional ED initiatives**

- C. **Engage regional stakeholders** in interviews & focus groups
- D. Conduct regional **economic competitiveness assessment**
- E. **Take inventory & assess** regional ED capacities; explore joint efforts F. Highlight **3–5 collaboration areas** for potential

II. Alternatives Analysis

- A. Evaluate **operational models** for regional ED collaboration
- B. Nominate major **program emphases and activities**
- C. Describe anticipated outcomes over short, medium & long terms and estimated level of engagement
- D. Highlight opportunities and challenges associated with each approach, assess feasibility, and align with existing capacities

III. Recommendations & Report

- A. Synthesize information to devise recommendations for delivery model, governance structure & major focus areas
- B. Organize strategy by focus area including implementation tactics, timing, success measures, participating entities & partners
- C. Present strategy to REDS Steering Committee and key stakeholders
- D. Develop communications plan to include tools such as a website, email distribution, updated for the public and media, etc.
