Dockless Vehicle Pilot Program

MOUs signed with 4 Vendors: Lime, Bird, Spin & Lyft

Program began in Summer 2019


Provisions

- Start with minimum 50 vehicles/vendor; ramp up gradually to minimum 200 vehicles & maximum of 500 vehicles/vendor
- Permit increasing maximum if daily use warrants

 Average weekly ridership: 1 trip/day for bikes, 3 trips/day for e-scooters
- 15 mph max speed
- Operations permitted between hours of 5 a.m. 10 p.m.
- Note: Montgomery County Parks Department conducting separate dockless vehicle pilot program – similar MOUs/regs




Rider Drop-offs (= Destinations) — July 2019 All Vendors — Silver Spring & Vicinity




Rider Drop-offs (= Destinations) — July 2020 All Vendors — Silver Spring & Vicinity



Comparison of Monthly Use: July 2019 – July 2020









Comparison of Travel Patterns: July 2019 - July 2020
